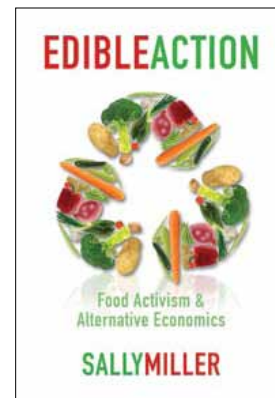


Fort St. James and New Caledonia

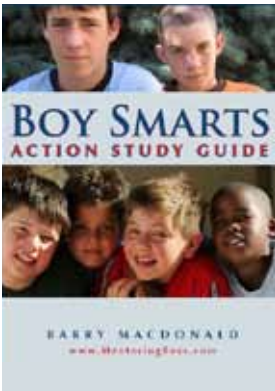

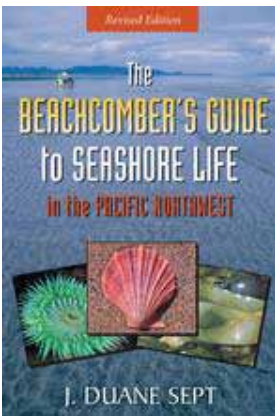

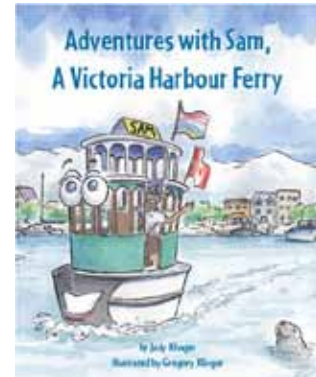
The Beachcomber's Guide to Seashore Life in the Pacific Northwest

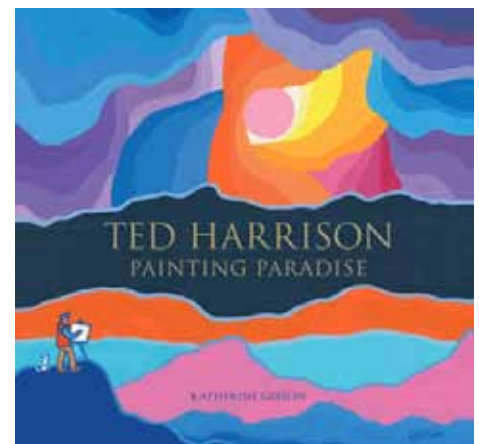
