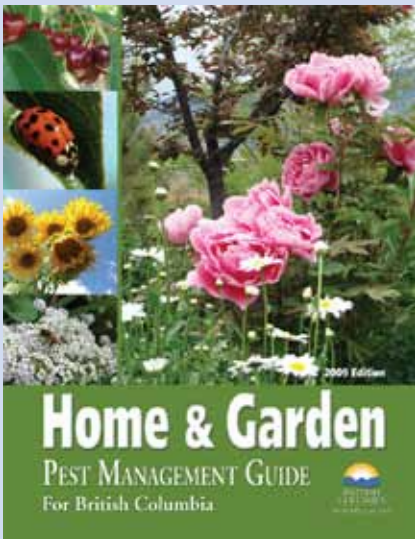

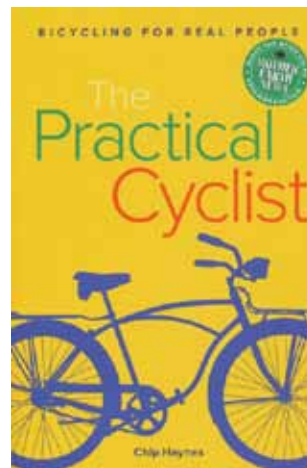

For those who have not been actively cycling for years, or perhaps are new to the sport. This book is uniquely geared to people who would like to come back to cycling, but don't know where to begin.

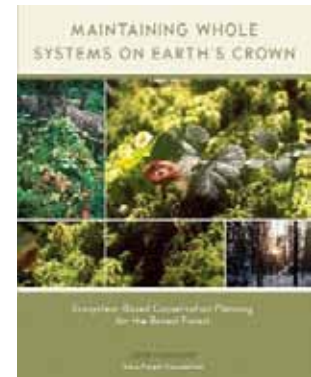
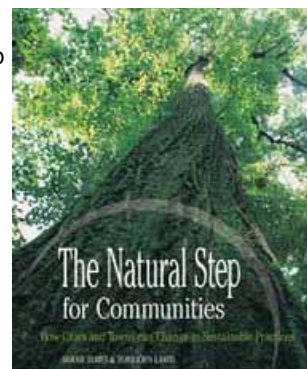

Teaching Green: The Elementary Years

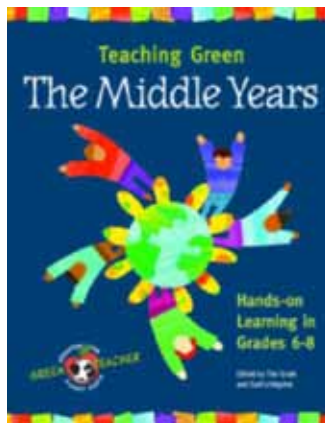
